Showcasing books through Book Exhibitions -'Bibliotheca' in History and 'हिंदी साहित्य सागर' in Hindi

'Bibliotheca' - an exhibition of books on History was jointly organized by the Library and Department of History on 26-Aug-2022 in the Reference Section of the Library.

The exhibition was inaugurated by the Respected I/C Principal Prof. Dr. Preeta Nilesh. Faculty members of History Department, Library Committee members, Teachers, Library staff members and students graced the occasion.

Around 270 library books in English and Marathi covering different aspects of India's History, World History, biographies of freedom fighters, inspiring historical personalities were exhibited. A few books covering the history of science, history of mathematics, history of literature, history of world economy, history of marathi newspapers, etc. were also exhibited. Around 380 library books on Hindi language and literature were exhibited. This tagging was appreciated by many users as it helped them to locate the collection of their choice of genre. Books on journalism, psychology, sociology, and biographies in Hindi were also exhibited. Enlist the help of N-LIST

Almost a year ago, I attended an online session on how to avail the various eresources for research, which was organised by Department of Psychology and the Library. We were guided by our Librarian Mr. Paritosh Pawar. He had explained to us how we can make use of these e-resources to enhance our knowledge. In addition to this, he gave us a demonstration of how to go about finding research papers through the N-LIST website, which was very helpful.

After the session ended, we were supposed to fill out a Google form to register with our library to obtain access to N-LIST. I was quick to do so because I was eager to know what kind of research papers I would find here. In a day or two, I received the access after following the standard procedure of setting a password. After this, each time we were assigned a topic to research on, I referred extensively to N-LIST, more specifically to JSTOR. I would find abundance of research papers in no time, that I could easily cite in my assignments. All through my second year, I utilised N-LIST as much as I could. Now that I am in my third year, I still find myself turning to N-LIST for almost anything I would like to research on or simply read about.

To everyone reading this, if you haven't yet registered to obtain this access, I would highly recommend that you do so quickly, so that you don't miss out on the vast amount of knowledge that this website provides us with, that too free of cost. The best part about this is that your access is valid until you're a student of this college, so make sure you make the most out of it!

The Bottomless Trove of Research

On the 27th of July, 2022, I attended the 'E-resources for Psychological Research' session hosted by our college librarian, Mr Paritosh Pawar. Initially convinced that I was being dragged into another tediously long seminar, I was pretty surprised to have had an experience which was contradictory to the assumption I had constructed before.

The session began with a discussion about why the information that you find in the 'first four to five links' of your Google search is quite erroneous as Mr Pawar made us aware of why and how accurate and objective research material becomes elusive to us thanks to the capitalistic Google algorithm. The session progressed to our introduction to the college's library website and to the N-LIST package for students that provides access to innumerable research papers, journal articles and E-books that do not have open access to the general population. It was rather exciting to know that all that knowledge that must remain inaccessible to others is now available to us at absolutely no cost.

The interface of the N-LIST website was userfriendly and inviting. Additionally, the vast amount of research data available to us on the webpage first-hand from various publishing houses was impressive, to say the least.

It was a delight to witness Mr Pawar impart all the experience he has with the website, his skill and articulation in making us familiar with N-LIST reflected the great amount of familiarity he himself has with the site. I left the session with a novel enthusiasm about the seemingly endless material that is available to us twenty-four-seven.

To conclude, I would only vouch that such sessions and seminars not only make a substantial difference in our academic life but also provide us with the confidence to face the world well-equipped with an everincreasing repository of knowledge.

Vaze College Library launched 'Panorama – The Virtual Bookshelf' on the auspicious occasion of International Women's Day - 8th March 2021.



In continuation with the practice, photo frames and biographies of the personalities that were displayed have been shown in the adjoining table.








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

Wise & Otherwise: A Salute to Life, by Sudha Murty, Publisher: Penguin Books India, New Delhi, 2006, Paperback, ISBN: 978-0-14306-222-6, 230 Pages, Rs. 150/-

Fifty vignettes showcase the myriad shades of human nature A man dumps his aged father in an old-age home after declaring him to be a homeless stranger, a tribal chief in the Sahyadri hills teaches the author that there is humility in receiving too, and a sick woman remembers to thank her benefactor even from her deathbed. These are just some of the poignant and eye-opening stories about people from all over the country that Sudha Murty recounts in this book. From incredible examples of generosity to the meanest acts one can expect from men and women, she records everything with wry humour and a directness that touches the heart.

First published in 2002, Wise and Otherwise has sold over 30,000 copies in English and has been translated into all the major Indian languages. This revised new edition is sure to charm many more readers and encourage them to explore their inner selves and the PBI – World around us with new eyes.

Mandate: Will of the People, by Vir Sanghvi, Publisher: Westland Ltd, Chennai, 2015, Paperback, ISBN-978-93-84030-39-1, 155 pages, Rs. 195/-

This is the first easy-to-read book about recent Indian political history. Pegged on the general elections that shaped today's India, Mandate: Will of the People tells the story of Indian politics in a gripping, page-turning style.

Vir Sanghvi, draws on his personal experiences and memories as well as scores of interviews to piece together an incisive and candid account of what went on behind the scenes. Peppered with little-known details and insider information, this book tells the stories behind the story and brings alive the men and women behind the headlines.

Mandate: Will of the People contains the real story of the declaration of the Emergency, the rise and fall of Sanjay Gandhi, the Punjab insurgencies, the assassination of Indira Gandhi and the bloody riots that followed her death. It tracks the emergence of Rajiv Gandhi and explains the Bofors scandal that contributed to his defeat. Many of the questions that linger over Indian politics are answered here: how did Narasimha Rao become Prime Minister? Why did he liberalise the economy? What was the Ram Mandir agitation really about? Why didn't Sonia Gandhi agree to be PM? And how did Manmohan Singh's weakness clear the way for Narendra Modi.

The attack on Mumbai shocked the world. For three days terrorists wreaked havoc over multiple venues in India's commercial capital, leaving a trail of blood, death and destruction. Reporters from Hindustan Times tracked the events as they unfolded at Cama Hospital, the Chatrapati Shivaji Terminus and followed the three-day siege at the Taj and Trident Hotels and at Nariman House. The collection brings together their dispatches as well as commentaries, profiles and columns published during the siege and its aftermath. This is a dramatic snapshot of the victims, heroes and perpetrators of the attacks and also of the outrage that still grips the nation.

Reporters from Hindustan Times tracked the events as they unfolded at Cama Hospital and rge Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus and followed the three day siege at the Taj and Trident Hotels and at Nariman House. This collection brings together the dispatches, investigations, profiles and commentaries published in the paper –including those written by major figures in their fields—during the attack and its aftermath.
